Second Sunday of Advent (A)

<u>Entrance antiphon</u>: O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

First Reading: Isaiah 11: 1-10

Psalm 71 Response: In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails.

Second Reading: The letter of St Paul to the Romans 15: 4-9

Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 3: 1-2

<u>Communion antiphon</u>: Jerusalem, arise and stand upon the heights, and behold the joy which comes to you from God.

Father Behr writes:

Who is the greatest? Muhammad Ali, the great boxer? The Rolling Stones, the rock and roll group? The national football team of France? The question about greatness is one human communities have asked for aeons. Something in human psychology wants an answer to this. It may be because humans, despite their best efforts, realize that their reality is hierarchical. There are winners and losers and not everyone has the same talents, skills, wealth.

St John the Baptist was the greatest spiritual leader of his generation or of many generations. Herod, the Gospels tell us, loved to listen to him. However, as St John himself knew, there was someone greater. Much much greater. Jesus is the greatest spiritual leader of all time and unlike some spiritual leaders he put his life on the line. St John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus. In his humility and zealous love for almighty God, he begs us to make way, to prepare a road in our souls, in our hearts, for Jesus, himself the model of humility. He comes to us as a defenceless baby born in poverty. Yet do we make way for the love and mercy he is offering us?

To prepare for God, to prepare for the ecstatic gifts he offers us, we need to place ourselves before him, before Jesus, humbly asking for forgiveness for the ways in which we ruin and spoil things for ourselves, for those around us, and for God, who wants us to be incandescent with love, with the joy that God the Son brought: the healing, the peace, the gift of eternal life. Nothing is free, but with God the gifts offered are gained with tremendous help from him. That's why he gave us his Son. His Son, our Lord Jesus, presents the map; he with his life, works, death and resurrection, shows us the way to the infinite everlasting joy of God's house, a place of such splendour and happiness we can only scarcely imagine. But that gift is there for the asking. Asking is the operative word: asking for our needs and asking for forgiveness, because sin actually takes us away from ourselves, from goodness and happiness. Baptism is intimately linked with the sacrament of reconciliation. In Baptism our souls are cleansed of original sin and energised by Jesus Christ. In the sacrament of reconciliation our souls become clean, we feel lighter, and we are able to love more fully and more wholeheartedly because of the grace we receive from our Saviour.

No one is richer than God. No one is greater than God. Nothing and no being is more beautiful than God and yet why do we not want to make the path straight for him to heal us and enrich us with his loving gifts? Why do we shy away from the joy he offers? Let us listen to John the Baptist and understand that the kingdom of heaven is being offered to us. Let us listen and understand the greatness of the one who offers this kingdom to us. Let us turn to our loving Lord Jesus as the feast of his birth, the feast of his being with us, approaches. Let us ask him with humility to forgive us and to give us wonderful graces so that despite all the troubles that might beset us in these times, we may feel the gorgeous lightness, the wonderous joy and the spiritual beauty of Christmas.
