## Brian Lawrence – An appreciation of a life well-lived

When Suzanne and I moved to Tenterden in 1994, we joined Saint Andrew's Church, then under the pastoral care of the late Father John Hagreen. We were impressed with the standard of music and singing and were introduced to Brian Lawrence with his fine baritone voice. Aside from his contribution to the musical life of the parish, he also co-ordinated the Church cleaning and assisted actively at Social events, his international suppers being a highlight. He also wrote the weekly bidding prayers and the Newsletter, always ending it with one of his famous jokes. In the background, he was very supportive of the Christian message and an active and practical ecumenist, singing in other denomination's Churches for services and participating actively in Churches Together in Tenterden events. A treasured memory for me is Brian and I singing the "Salve Regina" unaccompanied in a chapel in the Lavedan valley, south of Saint Savin and Lourdes. We shared our love of allotment gardening and would often compare notes and I am aware he was also a very active member of the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) I would very much like to repeat my condolences to his widow Frances and their sons Marcus, Adam and Luke. Baby blankets (These can be knitted as one piece or in sections sewn together. - Moses basket blankets – size range from 70x70cm to 70x90cm. These blankets must NOT have any holes large enough for you to fit your little finger through. We cannot give any blanket to a baby that has holes in it as they can get their fingers caught in these holes and this poses a risk to them.)

We are no longer giving out any formula or baby bottles so we would ask that you no longer give us any of these. We always include a small gift for the Mum so any special toiletries would be appreciated.
